

ORTHODOX FOOD CENTER NEEDS YOU

We need their support to help with shopping at the Worcester County Food Bank food bank and to assist with our monthly food distribution on Saturday mornings. Together, we can make a significant impact on our community.

This is the schedule of support. We need to ensure we cover the week/weekend where St. Nicholas is responsible. Our parishioners should know that they can help any weekend they are available, all help is appreciated.

- 1st week of the month is St. Nicholas' responsibility (6 month schedule. **2024**: 11/2/2024, 12/7/2024, **2025**: 1/5/2025, 2/2/2025 3/2/2025 & 3/29/2025
- 2nd week is St. Spyridon
- 3rd week is St. George
- 4th week is St. Mary's
- The 5th week schedule is attached

The ask for St. Nicholas community is:

- 1)Volunteer the Saturday that St. Nicholas is responsible to bag and distribute food to those in need
- 2) Additionally, volunteer to shop at the Worcester County Food Bank (474 Boston Turnpike, Shrewsbury, MA) 1 time during the week leading up to our distribution weekend. Katina will accompany you with the shopping. You don't need to commit to both activities monthly.

What does shopping at the Worcester County Food bank require?

One a defined date and time, shop for the various food products available at the Worcester County food bank, pack the items into your car, and transport the groceries back to St. Spyridon's Food Pantry in Worcester. This is a warehouse facility and products we shop for are bundled in bulk, for example when we pick up a pasta, we get a box of pasta that may contain a dozen packages of pasta. If we pick up potatoes, it is bundled into a sack (50 lbs) that contains 10-5lb bags of potatoes. Likewise when we get a case of chicken, it is a case containing 8-10 frozen chickens. Shopping requires that you can lift these items multiple times.

What does Saturday support look like?

Food distribution to those in need is from 10 am to 12 noon time. However, we ask that you arrive by 8:30am to 9:00 am to help to set up tables and make and organize the backs of groceries, break down boxes and help with food distribution and then clean up and shut down.

Once I know who can help, I will send out an email monthly to check availability for Saturday bagging and distribution and I will provide the dates and times if able to assist with shopping. Parishioners interested in supporting this cause, please contact Katina Cocavessis at 508-277-1063

STAY CONNECTED: Like our Facebook.

With the upcoming Holidays it can be a time of joy and connection for people with dementia and their families, but they can also be challenging. Here are some tips for making holidays more enjoyable for people with dementia and aging adults.

Involve the person

Ask the person what they would like to do and include them in preparations. They might enjoy helping with food, wrapping gifts, or decorating.

• Create a comfortable environment

Choose a familiar place, and if meeting indoors, open windows and screen doors. If meeting online, use familiar technology and allow time for screen breaks.

• Simplify traditions

Focus on joyous moments and celebrations that are inclusive and participative. You can also try sensory-based activities that engage their senses, such as music, gentle textures, or familiar scents.

Consider the length of stay

Shorter trips may be better for some people with dementia. Day trips can be a nice way to get away from home without having to stay the night.

Focus on the present

Focus on what the person is still able to do and what they choose to do now, rather than dwelling on what they used to do.

• Be patient

Take on fewer tasks and let go of activities that seem overwhelming, stressful, or too risky.

• Build on traditions

You can build on traditions and memories, or experiment with new traditions that might be less stressful.
