THE FAITH MAGAZINE October/December 2024 – We received the Faith magazine and you can take a copy with you from the candle stand.


SATURDAY OF THE SOULS BEFORE EASTER:

TRIODION - The Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee is the first Sunday of a three-week period prior to the commencement of Great Lent. It marks the beginning of a time of preparation for the spiritual journey of Lent, a time for Orthodox Christians to draw closer to God through worship, prayer, fasting, and acts of charity. It is also on this day that the Triodion is introduced, a liturgical book that contains the services from this Sunday, the tenth before Pascha (Easter), to Great and Holy Saturday.

Let us flee the Pharisee's conceited vaunting; let us learn the Publican's humility, and cry with groans unto the Savior: Thou Who alone art swiftly reconciled, be gracious unto us.

Romanian Orthodox Church marks 100 years since becoming a Patriarchate

Romanian Orthodox Church proclaims 16 newly canonized Saints on Patriarchate Centennial



The Romanian Orthodox Church officially proclaimed sixteen newly canonized saints on Tuesday, during a historic ceremony at the Patriarchal Cathedral in Bucharest, attended by Patriarch Daniel and the members of the Holy Synod.

The proclamation ceremony took place after the Divine Liturgy, marking the 100th anniversary of the Romanian Patriarchate. The event gathered members of the National Church Assembly and hundreds of believers on Metropolitan Hill.

Proclamation of the Saints

Patriarchal Auxiliary Bishop Varlaam of Ploiești, who also serves as Secretary of the Holy Synod, read the Synodal Tomos, officially announcing the sixteen new Romanian saints.

"Today, our Orthodox Church brings great joy to its faithful on the Centennial of the Romanian Patriarchate, as it adds to the calendar of saints those righteous ones who pleased God from among the Romanian people."

The decree highlighted that these newly recognized saints lived lives of prayer, fasting, repentance, humility, and love, achieving spiritual perfection.

"Some of them paid for their confession of faith with their lives, being crowned with the glorious wreath of martyrdom. Others endured continuous, bloodless martyrdom, suffering imprisonment, torture, and endless humiliation, and even after their release, they continued to be persecuted by those who denied God."

"Neither hardship, distress, hunger, lack of clothing, nor danger could separate them from the love of Christ. In all these things, they proved to be more than conquerors through Christ, who loved them," the synodal text stated.

Following the reading of the canonization decree, icons of the new saints were presented and the Tronos Byzantine Choir chanted their troparia.

Patriarch Daniel described the sixteen saints in his address as "the most precious fruit that our Church has offered in these 100 years."

"Through them, the mysterious work of the Holy Spirit in the Romanian Orthodox Church is more intensely revealed."

He emphasized that they were canonized because their lives bore clear signs of holiness, including: Orthodox faith,

A life of repentance and prayer,

Humble and merciful love for others,

Sacrificial confession of faith,

Miracles attributed to them,

The veneration of the faithful.

The Patriarch clarified that their canonization is a recognition of their sanctity beyond any political context, reaffirming that true Christian witness does not endorse worldly ideologies but rather the eternal values of faith and love for God.

"The Centennial of the Romanian Patriarchate is, therefore, a moment of sacred joy and gratitude for the entire Romanian Orthodox Church. Looking back, we see not only a rich history but also a profound spiritual legacy left by our predecessors—patriarchs, hierarchs, priests, monks, and lay faithful—who defended and transmitted the Orthodox faith over time."

THE SUNDAY OF THE PUBLICANAND THE PHARISEE

(Gospel reading: Luke 18:10–14).

On this and the following two Sundays, the theme is repentance. Repentance is the door through which we enter Lent, the starting-point of our journey to Pascha. And to repent signifies far more than self-pity or futile regret over things done in the past. The Greek term metanoia means 'change of mind': to repent is to be renewed, to be transformed in our inward viewpoint, to attain a fresh way of looking at our relationship to God and to others. The fault of the Pharisee is that he has no desire to change is outlook; he is complacent, self-satisfied, and so he allows no place for God to act within him. The Publican, on the other hand, truly longs for a 'change of mind': he is self-dissatisfied, 'poor in spirit', and where there is this saving self-dissatisfaction there is room for God to act. Unless we learn the secret of the Publican's inward poverty, we shall not share in the Lenten springtime.



February is National Senior Independence month!

Independence gives each of us a sense of purpose and the ability to still be independent and exercise autonomy is an important component to mental and physical wellbeing. What are ways that we can directly aid older adults to keep independence?

- 1. Prioritize safety Safety First! There are several precautions you can put in place to aid safety. Remove clutter and other tripping hazards, add handles, guardrails, and other stabilizers, and have technology in place that can be used one if your loved one need it.
- 2. Support social engagement: Connection is key to a happy life. Supporting your loved one's ability to see friends, talk to and be around others will help support a sense of purpose and community.
- 3. Involve them in day-to-day activities: Giving older adults the same treatment, opportunities, and experiences that you would have given them twenty years ago gives the older adult the opportunity to make decisions and choices about their day-to-day living.
- 4. Encourage exercise of both mental and physical activities: Keeping our brain AND body active is crucial to a healthy life. Physical activities such as water aerobics, walking, gardening, and yoga are great ways to move. Playing board and card games, doing puzzles, playing along with game shows, or watching their favorite sports team are great ways to keep mental sharpness.
- 5. Utilize health-tech to aid mobility and independence: There are a number of different types of assistive health technology that can assist an individual's independence; walkers, fitness trackers, hearing aids, and fall prevention devices are just a few examples.
